

Travelling to the Hospital

The hospital is located in Dublin's northwest inner city, between Eccles St, Dorset St and the North Circular Road. It is easy to get to by public transport and is a 10 - 15 minute walk from O'Connell St in Dublin's city centre.



LUAS / RAIL

The Rail and Luas networks provide an excellent way to get to the hospital from various parts of Dublin and beyond. In many cases parking is available at various stations along the route. The Rail and Luas services will bring you within easy walking distance of the hospital and connecting bus routes to the hospital.

BUS

Dublin Bus offers a frequent, accessible and easy to use service from all over Dublin. Dublin Bus, Bus Éireann and Matthews have a number of stops conveniently located near the hospital and many more which will get you to the city centre, which is a 10 - 15 minute walk.



CAR

Mater Car Park

During the building phase, the number of car parking spaces in the Eccles St car park will be very reduced. We apologise for any inconvenience caused.

Visitor's car park, which is situated on Eccles Street, is open:

Monday to Friday 7:30 am - 9:00 pm

Saturday and Sunday 12:00 pm - 6:00 pm

Please do not queue for this car park when it is full

Public Car Parks

Parking within walking distance is available in Clerys on Malborough St, Parnell Centre on Parnell St, Ilac Centre on Parnell St, Arnotts on North Prince St, Jervis Centre on Jervis St and the old Mongey Plunkett site off Dorset St. These commercial car parks are signposted.

On-Street Parking

On street parking is available, a 3-hour maximum parking time limit applies. Parking disks are available from on-street machines.

Patient Drop off / Collection

There is a set down / collection point for patients at the entrance to the Phase 1A Ward block, Eccles St.

Clamping

Please note that Dublin City Council may ticket, clamp or tow-away vehicles for a number of reasons. These include:

- If your vehicle causes a hazard or obstruction, for example on a clearway
- If your vehicle is illegally parked, for example on a double yellow line
- If the time allowed on a Pay-and-Display ticket (max. 3 hours) has expired

Accessible Parking

Disabled parking spaces are available on the grounds at the Eccles St entrance 1A ward block and beside the Emergency Department on the North Circular Rd. There are a number of on-street disabled parking spaces on Eccles St.

TAXI

Taxi ranks are located opposite the front steps of the Mater Misericordiae University Hospital, Eccles St and outside the entrance for the Mater Private Hospital, Eccles St.

CYCLE

The hospital can be accessed by various cycle lanes across the city. Cycle parking is available at the bicycle shed by the hostel entrance on Eccles St. A Dublin-bikes station is located at the hospital entrance on Eccles St, nearby at Berkley St and Hardwick St.
